Food Fraud Incidents

Mumbai police busted a milk adulteration racket in Andheri West after a food safety tip-off, arresting seven people for taking branded milk packets, diluting the contents with water and resealing them unhygienically for sale. Authorities charged the suspects under Indian law to protect consumer health and food standards.

In a January 2026 police operation in İzmir, Turkey, authorities seized about 3.5 t of ethyl alcohol and around 600 bottles of fake liquor and arrested 35 suspects linked to the production of counterfeit alcoholic drinks. The crackdown is part of ongoing efforts to combat dangerous bootleg alcohol, which has previously been tied to dozens of deaths and public health warnings in the country.

Mexican health authority has issued a health alert about counterfeit Similac baby milk formula batches being sold irregularly online and in informal markets, which may lack proper nutritional quality and safety and pose serious health risks to infants. The agency urged parents not to buy these products and to verify batch numbers against official lists to avoid unsafe ones.

During 2025, Argentine authorities seized 17 000 kg of meat in poor condition during inspections targeting illicit slaughter and unsafe distribution, removing contaminated food from the market to protect public health. The action reflects food fraud concerns with all unsafe products prevented from entering commerce.

The Regional Tax Office-II in Karachi detained three trucks carrying 1 800 sugar bags with fake Track & Trace System stamps during an enforcement operation at Sassi Toll Plaza, aiming to curb tax evasion and illegal movement of essential goods. The trucks, allegedly loaded from Chambar Sugar Mills, were moved to RTO-II's NIPA premises for investigation and legal action under applicable laws.

Police in Rajasthan seized illegal liquor worth about EUR 140 300 from a truck on the Delhi-Mumbai Expressway in Dausa, hiding 1 071 cartons beneath rice bags. The operation by the Anti-Gang Task Force led to the arrest of a suspect and recovery of cash, with the vehicle impounded. Preliminary probes suggest the smuggled alcohol was being moved from Haryana to Gujarat.

Indonesian authorities seized nearly 100 t of smuggled frozen Pacific mackerel at Tanjung Priok Port in Jakarta, thwarting illegal imports and protecting local fisheries markets.

Despite Indonesia restricting official peanut imports from India, large volumes of Indian peanuts continue entering Indonesia through illegal channels, often rerouted via Malaysia's Port Klang. Indonesian authorities are stepping up enforcement and seizures to curb these unauthorised shipments, amid stricter quality and aflatoxin requirements that have reduced legitimate trade.

Italian Guardia Costiera seized nearly 28 t of illegal and expired fish during inspections in Sassari and Nuoro. Over 26 t lacked proper traceability or were expired, posing food safety risks. Administrative fines totaling EUR 5 000 were imposed, along with the seizure of the products.

The Punjab Food Authority inspected over 1 475 milk points and 346 meat shops, shutting two units selling unsafe milk and meat and registering two cases. They destroyed 7 516 kg of substandard meat and 345 l of harmful counterfeit milk to protect public health. Fines about EUR 8 000 were imposed on 96 food points for violations.

In Uttar Pradesh, a court in Aligarh convicted a smuggler for supplying methanol-contaminated liquor that caused the deaths of 106 people in the 2021 adulterated alcohol tragedy, and set the sentence for 20 January 2026. The sentence was 10 years in prison and a fine of EUR 600.

In 2025, the Carabinieri food safety unit in Padua seized around 100 t of unsafe food, including meat, dairy and bakery products lacking traceability or proper storage. Authorities carried out about 1 900 inspections, issued 757 administrative fines totaling roughly EUR 900 000, proposed closures for 23 businesses, and saw 15 people criminally charged for offences such as fraud and selling spoiled food.

In 2025, the Carabinieri NAS of Cremona carried out extensive food safety controls in the Mantua area, leading to the suspension or closure of around 24 businesses.
