


COVERAGE VS **DETAIL**




ADMINISTRATIVE BOUNDARIES VS **REAL CITY**

Beyond methodological issues...

Acknowledge your trade-offs, take a decision and stick to it

(make them explicit in your documents)

Be ready for criticism

(be transparent with your methodology and its drawbacks)

Facilitate dissemination and communication by playing with your data

(create sub-rankings, let people play with data, disaggregate by size, location, etc.)
