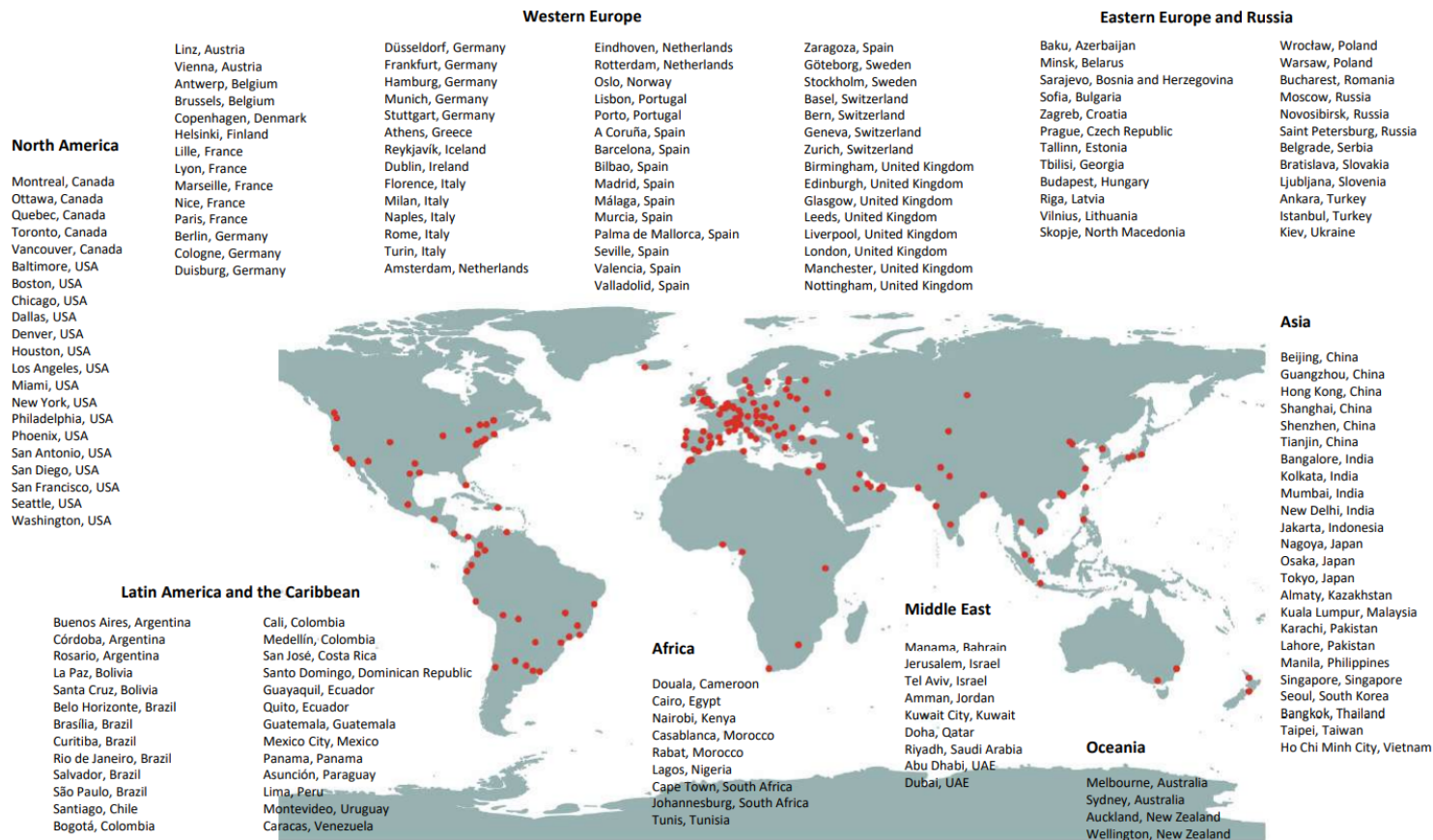

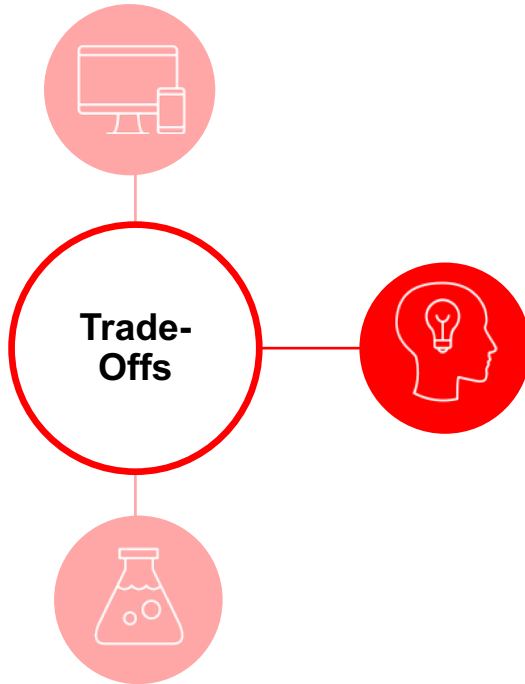
## COVERAGE VS DETAIL

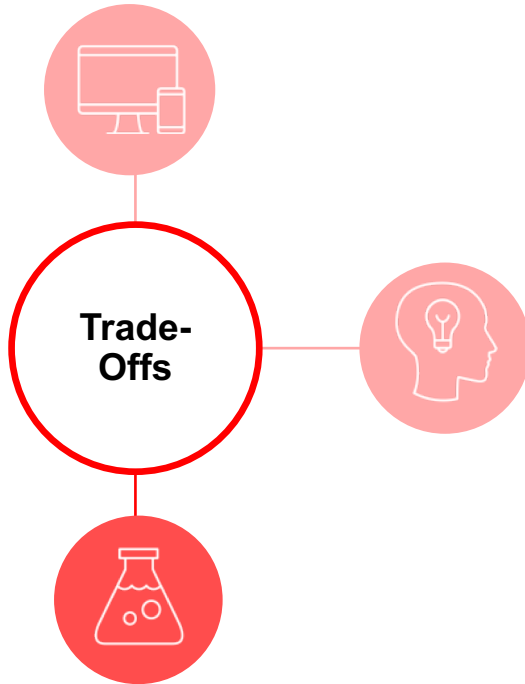

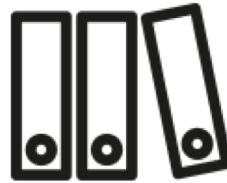

**Be ready for criticism**

*(be transparent with your methodology and its drawbacks)*

**Facilitate dissemination and communication by playing with your data**

*(create sub-rankings, let people play with data, disaggregate by size, location, etc.)*
