

European consumption of textiles is one of the top 3 pressures on water and land use




5 million tonnes








Road to 2030: Policy frameworks



Road to 2030: the vision of the Strategy

By 2030, all textiles placed on the EU market should be:

- durable, repairable and recyclable
- to a great extent made of recycled fibers
- free of hazardous substances
- produced respecting social rights and the environment

"Fast fashion is out of fashion"

Profitable re-use and repair services are widely available


Producers take responsibility for their products along the value chain


Circular rather than throw-away clothes have become the norm, with sufficient capacities for recycling and minimal incineration and landfilling

New rules: design



Ecodesign for
Sustainable Products
Regulation

Binding performance requirements:


- Durability, reusability, reparability
- Fibre-to-fibre recyclability and mandatory recycled fibre content
- Minimising and track the presence of substances of concern
- Microplastics release

N.B. For all products on EU market (imported or not)


Commission brochure on main sources of unintentional release of microplastics in the environment, including textiles



New rules: design



4-9% of clothing on the EU market are destroyed before use



Prevention of destruction of unsold consumer goods

Transparency requirements for those discarding unsold goods, and possibility to ban their destruction for relevant product groups.




Ban on destruction of **apparel** and **footwear** after 2 years

Empower consumers to make informed purchasing choices and encourage truly sustainable business practices and products

New rules: use



Empower consumers and tackle greenwashing


- Ban of generic environmental claims
- More visible guarantee information
- Ensuring voluntary environmental claims and labels are <u>substantiated</u>, <u>verified</u> and well <u>communicated</u>
- Introducing rules on public and private labelling schemes

Empowering Consumers in the Green Transition, in force since February 2024

Green Claims Directive, proposed March 2023



New rules: end of life



→ Upcoming obligation to establish separate collection of textile waste by 2025

- Textile waste from households and similar waste is <u>prepared</u>
 for reuse
- Mandatory and EU-harmonised national Extended Producer
 Responsibility (EPR) schemes with eco-modulation of fees
- Promote research and development into innovative technologies for circularity
- Definition of textile waste VS re-usable textiles





Biobased materials: an alternative?

Policy framework for biobased, biodegradable and compostable plastics – November 2022

- To defossilise industry, reducing our dependency on fossil resources & meeting our climate neutrality targets
- To create jobs

<u>Challenges</u> for textiles too!

- Secondary vs primary biomass
- Integrate the cascading principle
- Sustainability criteria to comply with:
 - RED III for land use and biodiversity
 - For GHG more research needed
