







# The Handbook in a nutshell




- It is a **policy-learning tool** which helps policy-makers (urban authorities, managing authorities) to design and implement integrated urban strategies
- It refers to Sustainable Urban Development supported by **ERDF in 2014-2020 and 2021-2027**.
- It tackles most critic and recurrent **issues and challenges** through **examples, data, external resources, recommendations**.



# Cross-sectoral integration

Addressing cross-sectoral integration in SUD strategies we aim at:

- acknowledging the **multiple and interlinked dimensions** of urban issues;
- highlighting the necessary **complementarity of actions** on different policy areas to build a sustainable development;
- helping to **overcome the "silos" thinking**, linked to the sectoral/policy field division of functions characterising public organisations.

# Cross-sectoral integration

To apply cross-sectoral integration means therefore to:



- Ensure a **coherence** in principles and objectives **among different existing policy areas**;
- **Collaborate among different departments**, also across levels, to co-produce policies.

# Findings from 2014-2020



- **27% of strategies integrates 4 Thematic Objectives.** Most used: TO4, TO6 and TO9
- **16% uses 10 different keywords.** Most used: mobility, energy, social inclusion

# Main issues at stake

- 1. Cross-sectoral integration within the cohesion policy structure**
- 2. Cross-sectoral integration in territorial governance**

# First issue at stake

## 1. Cross sectoral-integration within the Cohesion Policy structure.

- Dealing with **existing conditionality** (thematic concentration)
- Create an **enabling environment at all levels**: Common Provision Regulations, PO5, ITI and other implementation mechanisms, role of the Managing Authorities

# Learning with cases/1



## Challenge

How to integrate themes at Operational Programme level?

## Recommendations



- ✓ Explore the possibilities made available by Cohesion Policy regulation (PO5).
- ✓ Plan cross-sectoral integration at an early stage of funding process, already during the drafting of Operational Programmes.
- ✓ MA should encourage feedbacks from LAs to avoid mismatch between top-down decisions and local needs.

# Second issue at stake

## 2. Cross-sectoral integration in territorial governance

- Need to **overcome existing sectoral barriers** inside local administrative organisations
- Focus on the construction of a **collaboration between actors and departments** across local governance structures
- **Implementation** of holistic strategies and cross-sectoral projects

## Challenge



How to make different departments and offices working together?



## Recommendations

- ✓ Create offices of ad hoc committees to manage cross-sectoral policies in an interdepartmental way.
- ✓ Organise lunchtime talks and periodic presentations on good collaboration practices.

# Learning with cases/3

## Challenge



How to do cross-sectoral integration at local level in the implementation phase?

## Recommendations



- ✓ Invest in capacity-building to enhance officials' understanding of cross-sectoral integration (e.g. role of networks and experts).
- ✓ Include a broad network of stakeholders throughout the policy process to overcome possible bottlenecks in implementing integrated policies.
