Food Fraud Cases

In 2020, the UK's Food Standards Agency (FSA) has discovered 37 cases where consumers of takeaways services paid high prices for cheap meat and fish, but mislabelled as premium products.

Mislabelling Replacement/ dilution/ addition/ removal

According to the NGO Oceana, 44% of fish sold by fishmongers and restaurants is replaced with another species. Notably, the percentages are quite dramatic for specific species: 100% of merlin is replaced with make shark (endangered species); 88% of red snapper; and 53% of curvina is mislabelled. Tilapia (produced in Mexico by aquaculture) is often used for substitution purposes.



The Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA), as part of the enhanced fish species substitution surveillance (2019 to 2020), reported that only 8% of fish samples were mislabelled in the Canadian marketplace. Inspections focused on nice species: butterfish, cod, halibut, kingfish, sea bass, snapper (red and other), sole, tuna and yellowtail.
